We value high character and integrity. We believe our staff should reflect God's character as His representatives in the world.





#### \$3,360 HAITIAN COLLEGE FUND




Our Florida ministries have often taken trips to serve places of need in Haiti. Students and alumni from these ministries give regular gifts to help send Haitian children to college.

A champion picks up and carries the needs of a particular cause. At Impact, we may be talking about our donors, who often pick up the mission of ICM and help us carry it. We might also be talking about our students or alumni when we speak of champions, who are picking up the cause of the poor and the oppressed in a variety of ways.

We would love for each of you to be a champion for Impact and to champion the cause of campus ministry. Here are some ideas of how you might do that:

**Be an ambassador.** Speak up and speak positively about the work of campus ministry. Work as a representative when no formal representative is readily available.

**Pray.** No, really—pray like the Kingdom depends on it, because it does. Some of our most active champions are those committed to praying for our organization, praying for our staff, praying for students, and praying for the work.

Host a prayer journey. Whether it's virtual or not, there is likely a university campus near you. Gather some people who are like-minded and pray "on site with insight." Listen for what God is doing. Look for divine appointments. Make notes in a journal and compare them with others. Look for the work of God and the prompting of the Holy Spirit. Then, respond. Let us know when you do this so we can join you and help in any way we can.

**Lead a workshop.** Or ask us to host one at your church. This is one idea that can be done online in this crazy time.

And most importantly...

Mentor a college student. Right now, large on-campus events are limited. Our typical "reach" and ability to meet students is transforming. God could use people anywhere, no matter where you are reading this annual report, to find a local college student and mentor them. Disciple them in their spiritual walk, mentor them in their vocational pursuits, guide them in maturity. It will be one of the biggest investments you will ever make, shaping the life of a future leader and influencer. This is the vision, because even you can Impact the U; and when you do, you Impact the World.
