

We love this number, because expenses represent direct ministry. These dollars provide compensation and benefits for staff who wake up every morning committed to discipling and caring for every college student in their ministry. This money pays for the cups of coffee where meaningful conversations happen about how Jesus is real for young adults. These funds are spent engaging students in meaningful ways and helping them learn how to passionately follow Jesus for the rest of their lives. We take the money God provides through your generosity and we try to impact the world by changing the lives of tomorrow's artists, leaders, parents, teachers, and contributors. This money is spent directly on impacting the university today—and our conviction is that this impacts the world tomorrow.

OTHER ASSETS

This sounds like a nebulous category for the average report reader, but this number can represent anything from "cash on hand" to the larger assets we use to do ministry (things like computers and other property owned by Impact and used by our staff for ministry). This number means we aren't playing fast and loose with our finances. We aren't "stealing from Peter to pay Paul," and we aren't using money that's been allocated for something else to cover our bases. We have money that was given to support ministry; that money is accounted for and used to fulfill those purposes. We do ministry from the balance and not a deficit. We see this as good stewardship and healthy ministry.

This new category has shown up for us in the last couple years and represents the ability to underpin our ministry. Nobody wants to live in a world where a couple bad decisions could spell the end of the organization. Nobody wants to see ministries wonder if they'll be able to pay their staff next month. This number is the result of a lot of hard work and accountability (all the credit to God!) to make sure that we can do ministry with integrity and sustainability. The work of ICM is not going to disappear overnight. We're able to lean into the future and spend those dollars on ministry because of the right kind of organizational safety nets backing up that work.

Background: Lewis Integrative Science Building

Our Impact Utah team hosts an International Free Food Tent that feeds students at the University of Utah, serving around 200 each week. They have met students from Nigeria, Nepal, Ukraine, Bangladesh, Japan, Pakistan, Mexico, Malaysia, Iran, South Korea, Brazil, Honduras, and Mongolia. Furthermore, they are one of the first phone calls the university makes when a new international student is coming to town. Our team picks students up from the airport, takes them out for supplies, and invites them into their homes for a meal.

Our South Bend team established a student-led partnership with Bethel University for a commuter Bible Study. Many of these students aren't believers, and the team was able to give Bibles to over 50 students who have never owned a copy.

SUSTAINABILITY

All throughout this report, you've been seeing images from one of Impact's newest ministry locations, the **University of Oregon** in Eugene. It's a great example of all the things we've been discussing in this report, and a microcosm of what's true throughout our organization.

Support & Revenue: Impact adopted this ministry from a long-standing campus effort in Eugene (University Christian Fellowship), and donors helped us with a successful transition by continuing support of the ministry. Many donors have increased their support and new donors join every quarter. This is not only a huge encouragement for the staff in Eugene and our organization as a whole, it also serves as confirmation that God is asking us to reach college students at the University of Oregon.

Expenses: That money is then spent to make sure that our staff are supported well as they pour their hearts into their students. In all honestly, we don't know too many campus ministers who care more intentionally and invest more deeply in the lives of their students than our Eugene Team Leader, Emily Hopkins. Those students have been discipled and cared for well.

Assets: This ministry recently received a grant to help them continue building into the future. These assets represent the ability to dream big and step forward. They challenge us to steward the opportunities with grace and shrewd intention. We are currently in the process of hiring and placing more staff to make this team even healthier.

Sustainability: All of this makes our work at the University of Oregon more sustainable for the future. Multiple staff will help the ministry grow on many levels. Our staff will develop and flourish, direct ministry to students will be even more effective, and the outreach won't be synonymous with just one name or effort.

At the end of the day, we reach students all over the country in very similar ways. God used you to bear this fruit. Please know that you are appreciated, you are seen, and you are needed. Your prayers are more powerful than you realize, your financial support empowers us to be what God's called us to be, and the collaboration we have with churches make our relationships more robust and impactful.
